H1N1 Vaccination Program – Stage 1

> Rolled out 30 September 2009

- Everybody 10 years of age and over
- General practice, local council, public and private hospitals, Aboriginal Health Service, Aged care facilities, RDNS, RFDS
- Vaccines initially allocated to each provider
- Multi Dose Vials – education sessions
- C/W and State resources



H1N1 Vaccination Program – Stage 2

- > 3 December 2009 – vaccine approved for registration by TGA
 - All children from 6 months of age
 - General practice, local council, public and private hospitals, Aboriginal Health Service, RFDS
 - Providers encouraged to place orders



Vaccine presentation

- > **Pre-filled syringes (7.5ug/0.25mL)**
 - Children from 6 months to less than 3 years of age
 - 2 doses 4 weeks apart
 - Limited number doses available

- > **Multi Dose Vials (15ug/0.5mL)**
 - All children from 3 to 9 years of age
 - 2 doses 4 weeks apart

 - All children and adults 10 years of age and over only need 1 dose

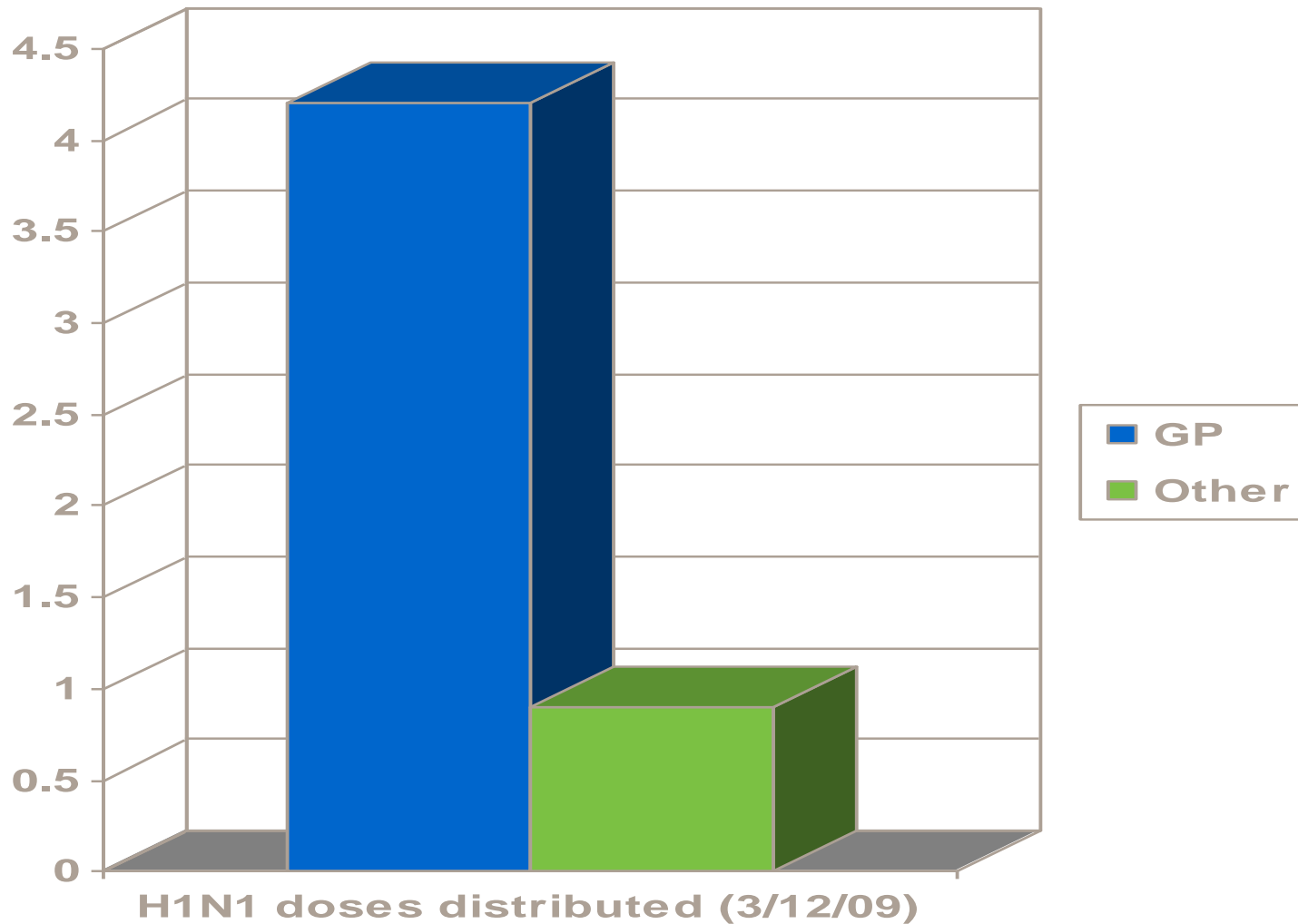
- > H1N1 09 influenza strain in 2010 seasonal flu vaccine
 - Potential 4 doses H1N1 administered to children
 - ATAGI recommends monovalent H1N1 not contraindication seasonal flu vaccine

- > Co-administered with other vaccines
 - Same time different sites, different syringes

- > MDV for children less than 3 years age?
 - Limited supply PFS, potential to order more

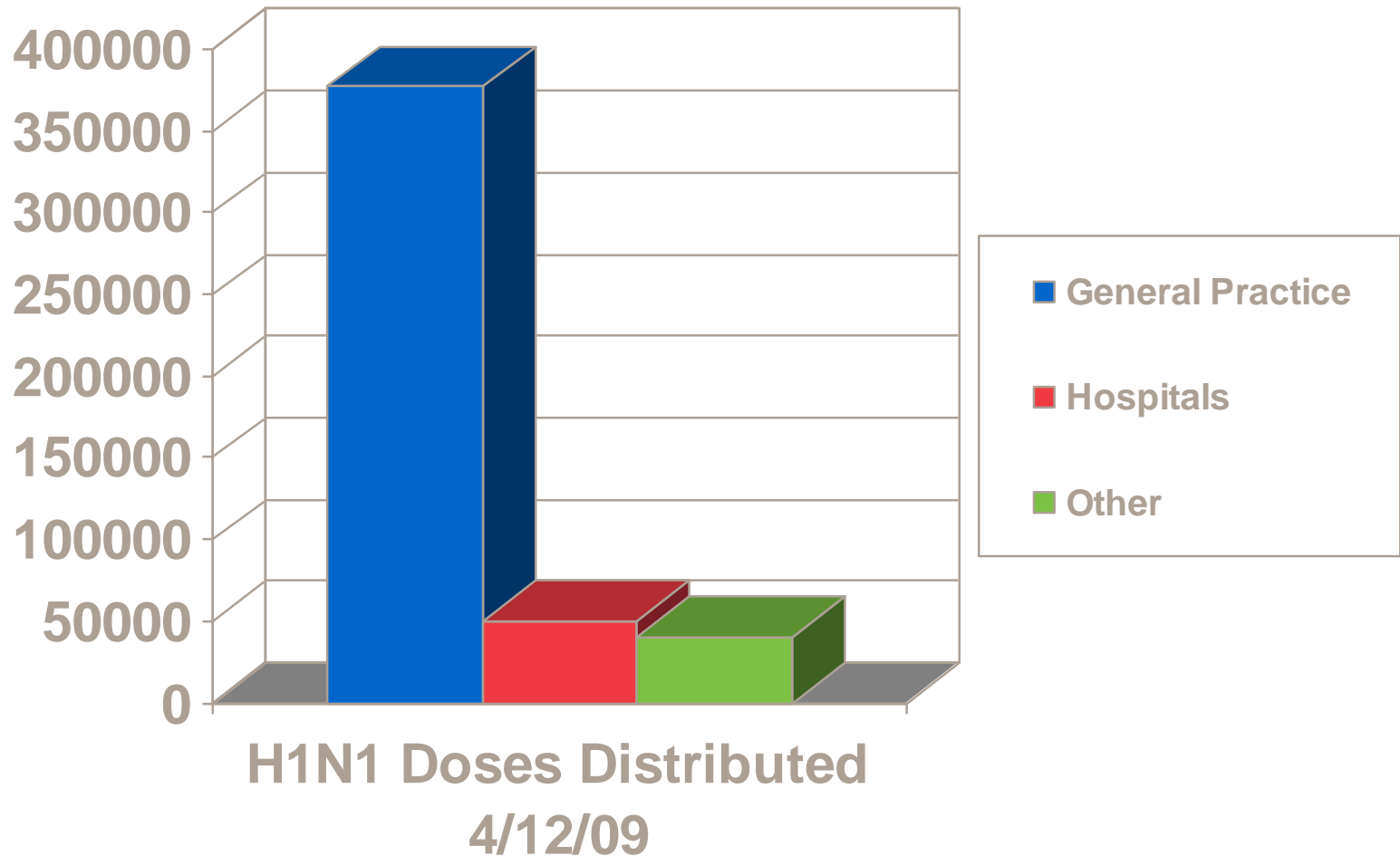
National – H1N1 doses distributed

> approx 5.2M doses distributed (4 Dec 09)



State – H1N1 doses distributed

> approx 500,000 doses distributed (4 Dec 09)





Vaccine safety

- > Reports received by Immunisation Section and TGA
- > Comparable to seasonal flu (52:55)
- > Anticipating increase in reports – children
- > Post licensure surveillance ongoing
- > All serious reports received by IS submitted to TGA
 - The TGA coordinate the reporting and advising States on all follow-up investigations of all reported events
