The major theme for Mental Health Research Day is 'evidence in practice' and will provide an opportunity for practitioners to share their success, new initiatives, research or challenges associated with interpreting, creating and incorporating evidence into practice. The aim of Mental Health Research Day is to create opportunities for discussion on ways to use evidence to enhance resilience and recovery processes for individuals and communities, ways to build multidisciplinary partnerships in research, and innovative strategies for evidence and knowledge transfer in mental health care.



Key Note Speaker Dr Anne Taylor, Manager of the Population Research & Outcome Studies Unit, SA Health, is an Adjunct Associate Professor in Department of Medicine at the University of Adelaide and the Division of Health Sciences at University of South Australia.

Anne has twenty years experience in the field of health-related behaviours and chronic disease epidemiology. As a specialist in population

surveillance methods, Anne contributes substantially to the design of population survey methodology and has managed many large-scale population studies over the last decade. She has expertise in both the population perspective of chronic disease, as well as risk factor monitoring and surveillance.

Anne is involved in local, national and international research collaborations and is widely published.
