Session Synopses

Clinical Stream

Elective 1: Emergencies in General Practice- Paediatrics

Speaker - Dr Jason Bament, , Modbury Hospital Emergency Department Director

Dr Jason Bament, has a wealth of clinical and teaching experience, Dr Bament will be addressing a number of topics including severe dehydration, upper airway obstruction, respiratory failure, head injury and sepsis in children.

Learning Objectives:

- Identify clinical signs indicative of serious illness in child
- Review clinical features / management of common paediatric emergencies

Elective 2: Emergencies in General Practice- Cardiology

Speakers- Dr Patrick Disney and Dr Daniel Cehic, Adelaide Cardiology

Dr Patrick Disney plays a central role in running the echocardiography laboratory at Adelaide Cardiology. Dr Disney has established an adult congenital heart disease clinic at the Royal Adelaide Hospital and has also worked closely with the Cardiology Department at the Women's and Children's Hospital to set up a transition clinic for adolescent patients.

Dr Daniel Cehic has an active interest in teaching medical practitioners and is also involved in the training of SA Ambulance Intensive Care Paramedics.

Learning objectives:

- Up date in the guidelines for treatment of acute and chronic heart failure
- To recognise the benefits exercise has in improving mortality and morbidity in heart failure
- To review current evidence for managing unstable angina
- Update at recognising and managing common arrhythmias

Elective 3: Emergencies in General Practice- Endocrinology

Speaker - Dr Patrick J Phillips, Senior Director, The Queen Elizabeth Hospital, Department of Endocrinology.

Dr Patrick Phillips is the Director of the Diabetes Centre and Endocrinology at The Queen Elizabeth Hospital. Dr Phillips has for many years been at the forefront of diabetes research and treatment. Dr Phillips recognition of the importance of gathering population information on diabetes has lead to the setting up of the North West Adelaide Health Study. Dr Phillips is keen to monitor the high rate of undiagnosed diabetes in the population. He warns that there are perhaps as many people with diabetes of which they are not aware as there are people diagnosed with diabetes. Dr Phillips will be presenting on Endocrinology, particularly Type 2 Diabetes (NIDDM) a common chronic disease in Australia.

Learning objectives

- To recognise what are the imperatives in changing a person with type 2 diabetes from oral hypoglycaemic to insulin
- To understand the concept of therapeutic inertia and its impact upon diabetes outcomes
- To understand what are the urgent complications of diabetes which need rapid assessment and referral
- To learn about best practice management of hypoglycaemia

Elective 4: Emergencies in General Practice- Wound, Burn & Hand Injuries

Speaker- Dr Peter Sylaidis and Dr Tony Moore, Adelaide Plastic Surgery

Dr Peter Sylaidis is a plastic and reconstructive surgeon working as part of the, Adelaide Plastic Surgery Associates. Dr Sylaidis provides all types of cosmetic, plastic and reconstructive surgical procedures and is a volunteer surgeon for InterPlast, providing free plastic surgery service to developing countries. Peter's specialty interest is in head and neck plastic surgery and he has a great passion for teaching.

Dr Tony Moore is the senior partner of Adelaide Plastic Surgery Associates. Dr Moore is credited with the introduction of laser treatments and is an invited Member of the Faculty of the World Association of Laser Therapists regularly invited to speak as guest Professor at international meetings. Dr Moore makes frequent trips into Asia and the Middle East for both voluntary and educational reasons. Rotary awarded him a Paul Harris Fellow in 2000.

Learning objectives:

- To revise the anatomy of the hand with specific emphasis on peripheral nerves and vascular supply
- To review how to assess the hand's nerves, arterial pulses and venous drainage
- To review how to examine the hand, with special emphasis on assessment of an injured hand
- To review how to differentiate between arterial and venous ulcers of the lower limb
- To review the current best evidence for how and when to treat infected and non infected ulcers/wounds of the lower limbs
- To learn how to assess and manage burns in a primary care setting

Elective 5: Industrial Relations 'Fair Work Act'

Speaker- Shayne Bakewell, EMA Consulting

Shayne Bakewell will address the changes and additions to our Industrial Relations system to help practices minimise the effect of the Fair Work Act. Topics include unfair dismissal laws, minimum employment conditions and general protection legislation. Shayne has a reputation as a leading employee relations strategist, specialising in the resolution of complex business problems and cases. Shayne has a Masters degree in Industrial Relations and is the employee relations contributor to South Australia's 'In Business' magazine.

Speaker- Pru Tucker, Principal Coach, Lifeways

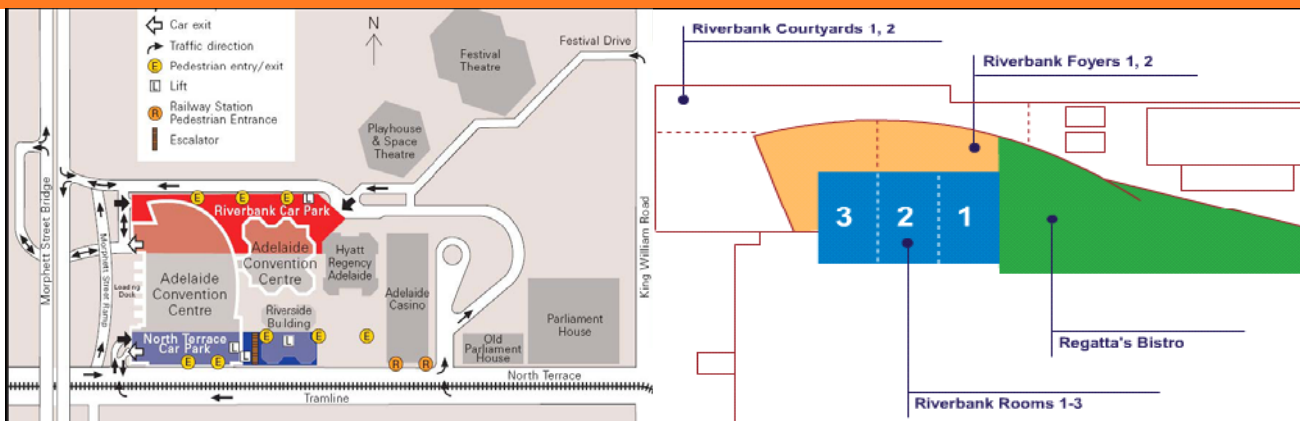
